Fr. Augustin and the people give THANKS for YOU! He reports that while many have nothing, because of donors like you, St. Louis Parish has been equipped to serve the community with food rations and an outpouring of love and sense of belonging when people have needed it most. Emergency help that was sent by St. Francis and St. John's (Waynesboro) was a lifeline for many. St. Louis Parish was able to contribute food kits of rice, beans, and oil to 1000 families! Many families had expressed defeat, feeling forgotten and helpless. Knowing that we remember them gives them hope. Concern remains going forward as the Haitian families face food insecurity. We will continue to work with Father for the good of the community and will keep you updated. The parish community remains vibrant in faith and worship. They are celebrating a gracefilled Advent Season and pray for all of us every day.

It's still not clear what the near future holds for Haiti. The United States has proposed that the U.N. endorse a non-U.N. force to try to battle the gangs and stabilize the country. Recent reports indicate the U.S. is attempting to recruit Canada to lead such an expedition. Haitians are torn, realizing their lives without fuel, without electricity and without adequate food, are unsustainable, but fearing a new outside mission, the likes of which have too often spelled disaster for Haiti despite stated good intentions.

News from Bob's Clinic

We thank all who contributed to the Bob's Clinic Challenge! We were able to raise more than \$20,000 which will help to sustain the clinic's good work by providing salaries for the doctor and nurses and support staff. The clinic has

extended its outreach programs and has worked hard to keep the community healthy and educated about cholera prevention, which is rearing its head in Haiti again!! There have been several emergencies that have been able to be addressed because of your support. The clinic is a beacon of light in the parish!

News from St. Louis Parish School

The first day of school for the 2022-23 year was delayed to October 14 due to the political situation in Haiti. We have a growing attendance and dedicated teachers. Fr. Augustin and the parents built a temporary area for the added classes this year. Thank you for your support and prayers for them! Even with the increased costs of food, we have been able to continue to feed the students each day.
