Bob's Clinic Challenge 2020: The clinic has limited resources. It is difficult to meet the extreme needs of patients with infectious diseases, severe injuries, and high risk expectant mothers. Diagnostic testing can be a challenge. Inconsistent electricity is supplemented by solar power and batteries. The availability of adequate medicine is a continuous problem. And Fr. Augustin writes in a recent email: The situation becomes more difficult in Haiti. The government in Haiti has devalued the US dollar. Therefore, we do not get enough goudes (Haitian money) in the exchange to meet the expenses in goudes. We really need to pray for Haiti. All this affects the increase in food prices.
