News from La Gonave

The 2014 Kindergarten Class celebrated graduation on June 20th! 22 graduates celebrated with a wonderful party for the entire school. School is not in session for the summer months and will reconvene in mid-September. However, your generosity allows us to continue to feed the children each day during the summer. Fr. Beneche has arranged camps in the morning and the children eat at noon and then return home. The camps also allow us to pay the teachers during the summer.

As you see in the pictures, the library is up and running and will be available to the children and the teachers at the school with the new school year. The books will be kept in the secure glass and wood case which was built by a parishioner of our twin parish. The Haiti Outreach Committee is offering a new way to help support the library by launching an "Honor with Books" program. We are very fortunate to have the dedication of committee member Diane Pekala to oversee this new initiative. Typically, the summer months constitute the "rainy" season on La Gonave and is a very important season as the cisterns are refilled, crops grow more easily, construction work can be better accomplished because water is needed to make concrete. This year, the rainy season has not come in force and this creates many hardships for the people. Please keep our brothers and sisters in Pointe-a-Raquette in your prayers as they deal with this difficult situation.

News from Bob's Clinic

A painful mosquito-borne virus that has been spreading rapidly across Haiti and the rest of the Caribbean since its arrival in the hemisphere in December has hit the island. The common signs of chikungunya (pronounced chik-en-gun-ye) are painful joints and a high fever. The people appreciate that they can come to Bob's Clinic to see Dr. Jimmy and the nurse as they recover. There is no real cure and thankfully, it is not fatal. Patients usually recover in about 2 weeks but ibuprofen and IV fluids are important. Luckily, once infected you cannot get the virus a second time.


