The students are off to a great start this school year! Marie and Angie worked on an assessment of the school building and environment with the teachers and community to explore ways to improve the current school facilities. Father Augustin's great dream to build a new school building may be years in the



making so the current school needs attention. St. Louis Parish is adopting a partnership VISION PLAN— $F\hat{e}$ Lekòl Nou An Bèl—Make Our School Beautiful! This new initiative created short term goals for improving the school: repair the roof that creates a river through the classrooms, provide a fan for ventilation in the 6th grade classroom, build partitions for the first grade class, buy commercial grade buckets and mops for the latrine area, build an appropriate latrine area for the kindergarten classes, build a cistern to provide the school with a

much needed water source, place quality trash cans in each classroom and on the playground, plant trees in

the school yard as class projects, buy needed materials for the kindergarten classes, create a safe space for kindergarten naps, and start a 6th grade leadership program based on the school patrol model.
