News from Pointe-a-Raquette

Fr. Augustin reports that while life was almost impossible in Port-au-Prince for the past several months where the streets were blocked, and protests became violent, the community on La Gonave remained peaceful. However, the chaos did have effects for them—merchants could no longer go to the market, and many stores are closed. The price of goods also increased dramatically. Concern remains going forward as the Haitian families face food insecurity. We will continue to work with Father for the good of the community and will keep you updated. The parish community remains vibrant in faith and worship. They are celebrating a grace-filled Advent Season and pray for all of us every day.

Marie and Angie had to cancel their November trip due to the unrest but are hoping to travel to visit the people in January 2020. Pray that this is possible!



We thank all who contributed to the Bob's Clinic Challenge! We were able to raise more than \$20,000 which will help to sustain the clinic's good work by providing salaries for the doctor and nurses and support staff. The clinic has extended its outreach programs. Each week there are health classes at the school, and each Sunday after Mass, the doctors present Public Health information and education for the parish. The new doctors continue to be a beacon of light in the parish!

News from Our Lady of Pointe-a-Raquette School

The first day of school for the children was on September 12^h! We have a growing attendance and dedicated teachers. The school opened an 8th and 9th grade class this year. We feel very blessed as many of the schools on the mainland have been closed due to the political unrest. Our students have had no disruption and continue to learn and grow! Thank you for your support and prayers for them! Even with the increased costs of food, we have been able to continue to feed the students each day. The Outreach Ministry has started a School Building Fund to work with Father Augustin's dream to build a new school.

In his words: *I hope that this small project will not only help me in my research work, but also it will have its double economic aspect: first, it will help me to reduce my expenses for typing, and*



photocopying and for the other students in my school and other staff who will need these services. In fact, this small project will allow me to earn money. With my heart filled with joy I send you my thanks if you will have the will to accompany me for the success of my little project.
