# **Knights Ultrasound Drive close to goal!**

The Knights of Columbus began a nationwide initiative in 2009, to match funds donated by local Knights councils to provide ultrasound machines for their towns pregnancy help centers.

The Councils in Waynesboro, Harrisonburg and Staunton decided to combine forces and each raise \$12,850.00 to buy three ultrasound machines for their pregnancy help centers.

We just received word that Harrisonburg and Waynesboro have reached their goal! St. Francis has currently reached \$10,445.00. We are just \$2,405.00 shy of our goal. What is remarkable is that we at St. Francis were not able to begin our ultrasound fundraising until after the "Living our Mission" campaign. The Knights are actively seeking contributions and ANY amount is greatly appreciated.

#### Why is this initiative important?

We recently interviewed Wanda Crosby, RN and V.P. of Medical Services at ComfortCare Women's Health (CCWH) regarding the importance of an Ultrasound machine when assisting women who are pregnant.

How will the new ultrasound machine compare with the old, and why is it necessary to replace it? "The current ultrasound machine is over 10 years old, which is the maximum life expectancy for an ultrasound machine. We have gotten a word from the manufacturer that parts are not available for repair of the machine. The new machine is an updated version of the current one we use. So we do not anticipate a big learning curve for the nurses who do the scans."

Have you seen a positive reaction in abortion minded women who have had an ultrasound? "My favorite ultrasound story is of a young woman who had 2 children, was in an abusive relationship,

and found herself pregnant. She thought abortion was her only option and came into the ultrasound room thinking that. She did not want to look at the screen. As I was silently scanning her, she turned to look at the screen just as her 9 week old fetus waved at her. She sat up on the bed, tears streaming down her face, asking for a picture. I gave her the picture and she sat stroking it saying "I didn't know it was a real baby!"

She decided to carry and parent and allowed us to get her in touch with a battered women's shelter, so in essence we saved not only the life of her unborn but the life of her and her other two children. So yes, ultrasound does make a difference in the lives of women who are seeking abortion."

# How has having an ultrasound machine changed the way women think about their unborn child?

"Once they see that it is really a baby and has a heartbeat, their hearts are changed. Some of the women we see at ComfortCare believe the lies that the world tells them, that their baby is not really a human being. But when we can show them the reality of what their baby looks like and allow them to see that beating heart, they can't deny life exists in their womb."

"It is people like you that make my job possible, so I want to thank you for each and every dollar you give to make an eternal difference. You never know what plans God has for the lives that are saved due to an ultrasound at ComfortCare Women's Health."
