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Respect Life to Host Foster Care Speakers, Present 'Journey Bags' Sunday, May 19th



"Though my father and mother may forsake me, the LORD will receive me." Ps. 27:10

Children often come into foster care with nothing but the clothes on their backs. Journey Bags are backpacks filled with personal and comfort items for them to use when they are abruptly taken out of their homes. The goal of Journey Bags is to bless these children and let them know that they are loved, prayed for, and remembered!

One foster mom, Heather, recalls her experience receiving a sibling group late one night:

"Last night at midnight three precious little beauties showed up on my doorstep. They each had with them a blanket, a stuffed animal, and a book bag...their Journey Bags. I kept waiting for more, anything more, but nothing came. The investigator told me this was all they had. Our 5 year old had come with shoes which were so bad they had to be thrown away, one of our two year olds had no shoes, the other had two left shoes. When I asked about getting anything out of the home the investigator said it just wasn't going to be possible. The kids had nothing. Their worldly possessions consisted of Journey Bags. As I stared at those bags I began to cry. What if no one took the time to fill those bags and deliver them? What would our children have then? Absolutely nothing. Nothing to claim as their own, nothing to protect or cherish. Thank you for all you do. Thank you for my kiddos' Journey Bags."

On Friday, May 17th the Klub and Youth for Life

will be filling 30 Journey Bags for local foster children ages 8-12. These bags will be presented as a gift of St. Francis Parish by Respect Life at a special program devoted to Foster Care on Sunday, May 19th, at 10 a.m., in Assisi Hall. All are welcome to hear the following invited quests:

Nenita Fisher-Cromer, parishioner and Child Protective Services Supervisor with Shenandoah Valley Social Services will speak on the purpose and state of foster care in the local community.

Colleen Price will give a personal testimony on growing up in foster care and how it saved her from a life of abuse (and helped her to find God).

Charisa Knight from "The Forgotten Initiative" will share what TFI does and how people can get involved in helping foster children, even if they are not able to provide foster care themselves. She coordinates the Journey Bag project for numerous area churches on behalf of the Department of Social Services.

WHAT CAN GOD ACCOMPLISH IN 40 DAYS?

The most recent 40 Days for Life Campaign coincided with the Holy Lenten Season. Each Friday, vigil participants from St. Francis and St. John's joined together in prayerful witness outside the Planned Parenthood in Charlottesville.
